Electives

We suggest students complete at least 4 units in a subject area different to their degree, preferably a linked sequence of study in the same area.

This choice can include units from any degree in the University but is best chosen from the subject areas in the Bachelor of Arts.

Electives can be used to:

- Explore fields of study and ideas that inspire you. You may consider history, literary studies, philosophy, creative arts such as dance, photography, film and so on, gender studies, children's literature, journalism, design, language (other than English) or other fields.
- Complete a 4 unit suite that complements the main study.
- Complete a number of units that have some degree of coherency by completing at least two units in one area of study.
