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GENERAL INFORMATION

SPECIFIC COURSE INFORMATION

Compulsory zero (0) credit point units/programs/modules: AAI018 Academic Integrity (0-credit-point compulsory unit).

This course includes 80 days of supervised professional experience.

Students are also required to complete two zero (0) credit point units ELN010 and ELN011 as part of the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE) in order to graduate from their course. Students are expected to complete the tests in the first year for undergraduate courses and first trimester for postgraduate courses. This will assist in satisfactory course progression should you need additional support and/or test attempts.
