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Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS) Leader

Overview

PASS is a voluntary academic peer support program that utilises peer-led group study to help students succeed in traditionally difficult subjects or those that are perceived as difficult by students. This position facilitates weekly online Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS) in specific units to enhance students' understanding of the unit content and to develop study strategies and skills to improve academic performance in a collaborative, interactive and dynamic group learning environment.

The position reports to the Coordinator Peer Support Programs (PASS), while the Coordinator Peer Support Programs (PASS) is responsible to the Manager Peer Support Services.

Responsibilities

- Plan for and facilitate two 1-hour weekly online PASS sessions (one day-time session and one evening session) using PASS methodologies and approach.
- Administer an asynchronous group site on a weekly basis, posting content- relevant questions and activities for students.
- Set up PASS Zoom meeting sessions for the selected unit as per training and PASS Leader Zoom Guide instructions.
- Ensure session attendance records are updated regularly, and that the attendance procedure is followed.
- Actively recruit participants for PASS sessions, including visiting lectures to promote PASS, communicating on CloudDeakin, creating promotion slides, recording short promotional videos, and sending follow up emails.
- Attend (or view) the weekly lectures or other unit classes, as required.
- Provide electronic files of session plans, slides and other resources used in sessions each week to the PASS team.
- Ensure that all PASS surveys and evaluations are distributed and completed by students.
- Liaise with unit academics to ascertain unit requirements and provide weekly updates on the progress of the PASS sessions.
- Actively participate in ongoing professional development throughout the trimester, including observations and feedback, attending PASS Leader meetings, training sessions and SHS Masterclasses.
- Liaise with the Coordinator Peer Support Programs (PASS) to organise a replacement in case of illness or emergency.
- Refer any issues to the relevant area, such as Health Services, Counselling, Study Support, Student Central, DUSA or other Deakin services, as appropriate.
- Notify the Coordinator Peer support Programs (PASS) in a timely manner about any issues or potential problems related to a student or the program.
- Maintain a professional behaviour and appropriate boundaries at all times.
- Ensure the implementation of all University policies related to the areas for which the position is responsible, in particular, those relating to equal opportunity, occupational health and safety, academic integrity, risk management and staff development.
- Complete your PASS duties from within Australian shores.
- Other duties as directed by the Peer Support Services team.

Relationships

The PASS leader will have regular contact with the Coordinator Peer support Programs (PASS) and Senior PASS Leader to discuss the needs of their session/s and other workplace requirements. The leader will communicate with Faculty academics (as regularly as determined by the academic/s) to discuss promotion, students' communication and feedback. Additional promotion or activities may be required of the PASS leaders, including communication with Deakin staff from other areas and divisions.

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Selection

Qualifications and experience

- A current Deakin student enrolled to continue their studies in Trimester 1 2025.
- Successfully completed at least one trimester at Deakin.
- Received a grade of D or HD in the selected unit.
- Demonstrated unit content competency.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Previous experience as a PASS leader and/or in peer mentoring desirable, but not essential.
- Preference will be given to students who are enrolled in an undergraduate Deakin course.

Capabilities
