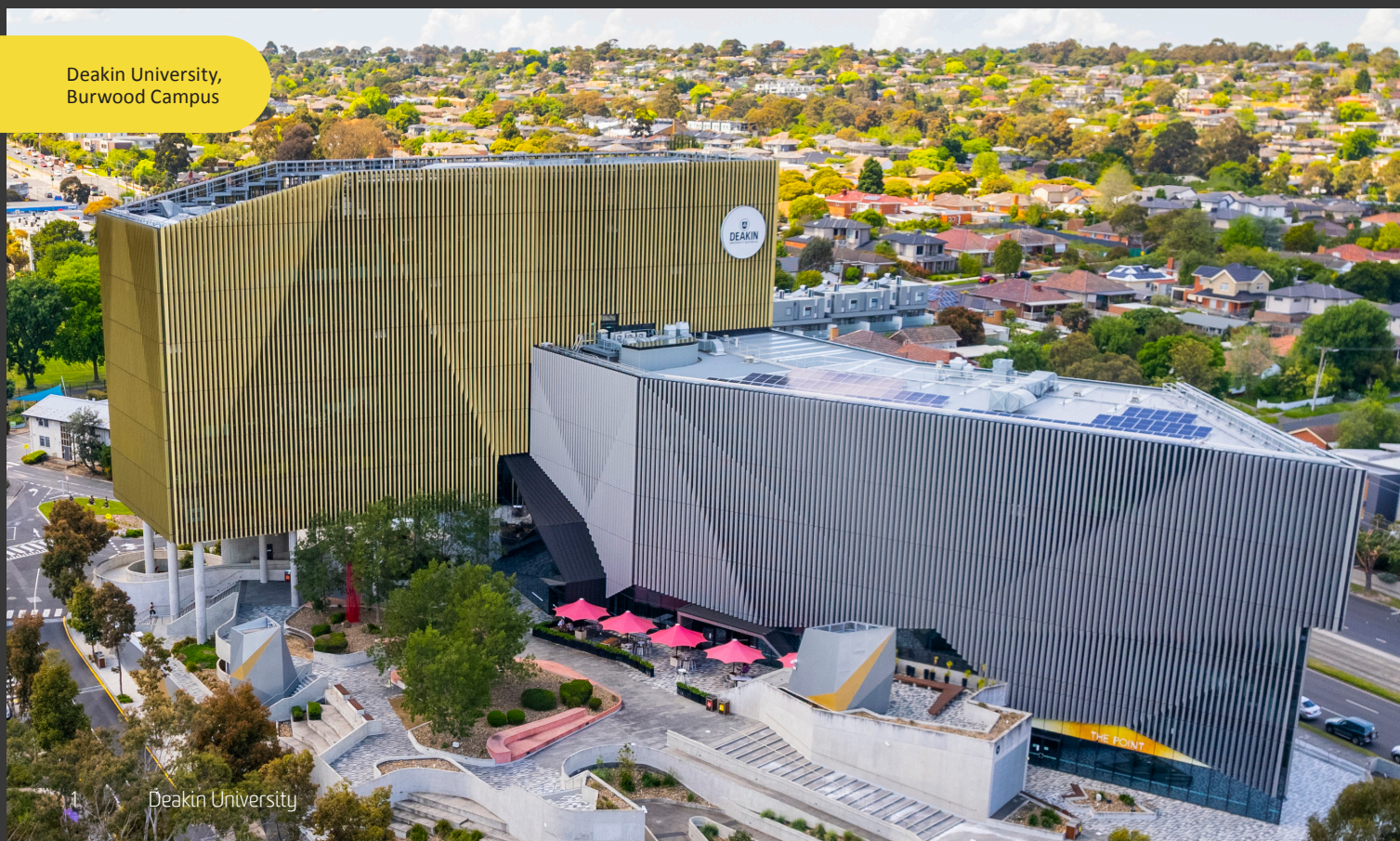
Deakin University, Australia, is ranked in the Top 1% of universities worldwide, according to ShanghaiRanking, and is among the top 50 young universities in the world (QS).

How to apply

International applications for 2025 open 1 February 2024, and close 30 April 2024.

Australia Awards scholarship applications

To apply for an Australia Awards scholarship, you will need to submit all the necessary details directly with the Australian Government, not Deakin University.

Firstly, visit the Department of Foreign Affairs Australia Awards webpage at dfat.gov.au/people-to-people/australia-awards/Pages/how-to-apply-for-an-australia-awards-scholarship or scan the QR code on the right.

Here you can check the opening and closing dates for your country and the link to the online Australia Awards application form. You will be required to nominate your preferred university and course on the scholarship application form.

A separate application to Deakin is not required. The Australian Government will pass on all your details to us when you select Deakin as your preferred university.



1 Visit the DFAT website

Visit dfat.gov.au/people-to-people/australia-awards/Pages/how-to-apply-for-an-australia-awards-scholarship or scan the QR code above to check the opening and closing dates for your country. Select your country of citizenship/residency from the list to find information on eligibility, priority areas and how to apply.

2 Read the handbook

You must read the Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook. The handbook provides information on general eligibility requirements, selection processes, entitlements and responsibilities.

3 Gather supporting documents

Check your participating country profile to see if your country requires additional supporting documents, such as referee reports.

4 Apply

Go to the Online Australia Scholarships Information System (OASIS). When you register online, you will be required to answer some questions to establish your eligibility. You will then be given a unique registration number, username and password.

Alternatively, you can apply by mail. Complete the hard copy application form and supporting documentation.

Entry requirements

Deakin degrees have eligibility requirements that students must meet in order to gain entry into their course of choice. This includes meeting Deakin's academic admission and English language requirements.

Academic entry requirements

English language requirements

Applicants will be expected to demonstrate that they meet Deakin's English language requirements either through previous study or by taking approved English language exams. Pages 5–8 of this brochure provide the IELTS scores needed to meet the English language requirements for select courses. Do you have the grades but not the English?

If you do not meet Deakin's English language requirements, you still have options available. You may wish to consider studying at the Deakin University English Language Institute (DUELI), based on our Melbourne Burwood campus.

Successful completion of DUELI's English for Academic Purposes courses can lead to direct entry into your Deakin degree course. For more information visit deakin.edu.au/dueli.

Be extra prepared for your studies

Australia Awards recipients are eligible to take the Intensive Academic Preparation (IAP) program at DUELI. The IAP is a five-week program that you can take before you start your degree. The IAP is designed to develop the writing, reading, listening and speaking skills needed to achieve success at university. This is an exclusive, high-level course for students who wish to excel.
