## D380 Course Rules

I understand that to qualify for the awards of Bachelor of Criminology (A329) and Bachelor of Cyber Security (S334), I must complete 32 credit points; 16 credit points in the Faculty of Arts and Education, and 16 credit points in the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Built Environment. Course requirements for both degrees must be satisfied. I also understand that to qualify for these awards:

I must complete a total of 16 credit points of study from the Faculty of Arts and Education – including a minimum of 12 credit points of **ACR**-coded Criminology units

Of these 12 credit points of **ACR**-coded units, I must complete 6 core units: ACR101, ACR102, ACR201, ACR202, ACR301 and ACR302

I must complete the other 6 compulsory **ACR**-coded credit points as Criminology electives, selected from: ACR203, ACR204, ACR210, ACR211, ACR212, ACR213 and ACR303 (note that ACR303 is worth 2 credit points; the others mentioned are worth 1 credit point each). The remainder of my Arts credit points are made up of specifically Arts-coded electives (which can include other Criminology **ACR**-coded units if I wish, but can also be any other Arts units from Deakin)

I must complete 16 credit points of core **SIT**-coded units from the Faculty of Science, Engineering and Built Environment – as well as the compulsory **SIT010** unit, Safety Induction Program. This unit is additional to the 16 credit points required, and is worth 0 credit point

I understand that if I decide to complete my studies with only one of these two degrees, I will come and speak to a Course Adviser for assistance
