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**D390 course rules** - In order to qualify for the award of Bachelor of Criminology/Bachelor of Psychological Science (D390), students must complete 32 credit points, which must include the following:

**Course requirements for both the Bachelor of Psychological Science (H344) and Bachelor of Criminology (A329) must be satisfied.**

AAI018 Academic Integrity (0 credit point compulsory unit);

16 credit points of Arts course grouped units and 16 credit points of Health course grouped units; and

No more than 10 credit points at level 1

**Psychological Science:**

3 core foundation Health units (HPS105, HPS104, HBS110);

11 credit points of Psychology core units (HPS111, HPS121, HPS201, HPS202, HPS203, HPS204, HPS206, HPS301, HPS307, HPS308, HPS310);

A 2 credit points of level 3 HPS electives or 1 level 3 HPS and 1 level 3 HXX units.

**Criminology:**

6 credit points of Criminology core units (ACR101, ACR102, ACR201, ACR202, ACR301 and ACR302);

At least 6 credit points of Criminology electives (ACR coded units) taken at level 2 or above;

At least 6 credit points of arts units at level 3 including ACR301 and ACR302;

Up to 4 credit points of electives chosen from Arts and Education course grouped units\*.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

This course map is a guide only.
