Geelong Waterfront

In the heart of Geelong's CBD, our Waterfront Residence, Brougham House offers 412 bedrooms across 10 floors. It's located next door to Deakin's Waterfront Campus and is moments from Geelong's spectacular Western Beach.

At Brougham House you can:

- Live with other people in shared apartments and townhouses ranging from 2 to 13 bedrooms.

Bordered by picturesque parkland, the accommodation at our Melbourne Burwood Campus is home to 1177 students. With a great mix of state-of-the-art contemporary student housing, students in Burwood enjoy a unique Melbourne lifestyle.

Our Burwood Campus couldn't be in a better location. It's just 30 minutes from the mountains of the Dandenong Ranges, the beaches of St Kilda and Melbourne's bustling central district. Metropolitan Melbourne and regional students are eligible to live on campus in Burwood.

Warrnambool

254 students have the opportunity to wake up each morning and look out over the beautiful Hopkins River from their bed on campus. Residents get to experience the peace and quiet of regional Victoria while living on campus at Warrnambool. Leisurely morning walks or a fish before class is the norm.

The campus is located on the Great Ocean Road, five minutes from local surf beaches and a two-hour drive from Geelong or the Grampian's. Day trips to explore nearby coastal attractions, beaches and the local national parks are all possible if you live on campus in Warrnambool.

At our Warrnambool campus you can:

• Live by yourself in a studio apartment.

Returners / Mature-age can also:

• Live with other people in our shared units.

Our self-contained studio apartments are all located in Hopkins View and give students a modern and supportive university experience. You'll have the opportunity to live in a self-contained studio apartment, while enjoying access to large communal kitchen spaces, a decking area with BBQ facilities, large common areas and lounge rooms, and multiple study halls – all under the one roof.

We offer a range of single and mixed gender accommodation options at each of our campuses and our residential student community is truly multicultural, with residents from around Australia and the world.

Our inclusive housing policy has been designed to meet the personal, social and academic needs of residents and the broader residential community.

These include areas of accommodation which have been exclusively reserved adult learners/mature age or postgraduate students, school leavers or those requiring affordable housing.

On applying you will have the opportunity to indicate specific preferences at certain campuses. These preferences are not guaranteed but include gender specific, quiet areas and accommodation for partners or couples.



Shared Spaces

Living on campus means you'll have lots of places to study, enjoy a break, or catch up with friends.

How to apply

With more than 2800 beds available across four locations, it's now time to apply. Places are available to both metro and regional students and due to demand for our accommodation you'll need to apply as soon as possible (it's free to apply). Apply now to avoid missing out.

How it works: 5 easy steps

Choose your campus

• If you're unsure which Deakin campus you'll be studying at, submit a separate application for each campus (one application for Geelong). Once course offers are made, we'll match up the correct campus application with your course offer.

Review the room types available at your chosen campus

• We can't offer you a room if you haven't entered a preference for it!

Choose your lease length

Review the Licence Agreement and Handbook

Click on the 'Apply Now' button to register and complete your application

• Complete your application in full - Incomplete applications may not be considered so make sure you follow the process all the way to the end. You'll receive an email when your application has been successfully completed. **DID YOU KNOW?** It's free to apply and both Melbourne and regional students can apply.



Who can live on campus?

The way you learn at Deakin is changing, but the need to connect with your peers remains constant. All Deakin students, regardless of study mode (full time, part time and cloud students) are eligible to apply to live on campus.

Deakin does not provide guardianship or specialised services for minors and as such recommend that students under the age of 18 years of age should seek alternate accommodation with suitable providers such as Homestay. In exceptional circumstances, and at the discretion of the General Manager, an application may be accepted for a 17 year old with additional terms and conditions applied.
