**D322 course rules** - In order to qualify for the award of Bachelor of Commerce/Bachelor of Laws (D322), students must complete 40 credit points, which must include the following:

24 credit points from the Bachelor of Laws, including:

18 credit points of core units and 6 credit points of law elective units, including 1 credit point of WIL/practical unit

16 credit points towards the Bachelor of Commerce, including:

7 credit points of core Commerce units;

An 8 credit point major Sequence;

A one credit point elective unit;

Level 3 - at least 4 credit points (which must be course grouped to a Faculty of Business and Law undergraduate degree)

Completion of MAI010 Academic Integrity (0-credit-point compulsory unit)

## GENERAL INFORMATION
