D303 COURSE RULES

In order to qualify for the award of Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary)(D303), students must complete 36 credit points, comprising of 24 credit points from the Bachelor of Arts, and 12 credit points from the Master of Teaching:

Bachelor of Arts Studies:

- Two approved Arts major sequences of at least 8 credit points each selected from: Anthropology, Arabic, English-Children's Literature, Chinese, History, Indigenous Studies, Indonesian, International Relations, English-Literature, Media Studies, Middle East Studies, Philosophy, Politics and Policy Studies, Sociology, Spanish, Visual Arts, Performing Arts
- ***Restrictions apply to major combinations. Please refer to the handbook for details.**
4 elective units selected from another of the groups of Arts major disciplines listed above (Students taking a major in Anthropology, Indigenous Studies, International Relations, Middle East Studies, Philosophy, Politics or Sociology must select 2 credit points of units in one of these areas or from the A310 History major among their electives)
- 4 credit points selected from Education Electives List A
- No more than 10 credit points at level 1, AND
- At least 6 credit points at level 3

Master of Teaching (Secondary) Studies:

- 7 core teaching units (8 credit points);
- 2 curriculum study units in first teaching specialist area;
- 2 curriculum study units in second teaching specialist area; and
- Completion of 60 days of supervised professional experience.

Students must complete all 24 credit points at undergraduate level to progress to postgraduate level study. A WAM of less than 60 results in an alternative exit from D303 with award A310 Bachelor of Arts.

*These units contribute towards the course requirement of 60 days of supervised professional experience (refer to handbook for number of days required in each unit indicated)
