Deakin will host the 2025 Science and Engineering Challenge – a nationwide STEM program where teams of Year 9 and 10 students compete in activities involving the principles of science, engineering, and technology. Students participate in an exhilarating day competing against other schools in fun and engaging hands-on activities, including designing an earthquake proof tower, building a bridge, providing electricity to a city and mastering the art of indigenous fish traps. Winning teams go on to compete in state and national finals.

Registrations for Geelong and Burwood events will open in early 2025.

Women in Design and Construction

Deakin University's 'Women in Design and Construction' immersion program is back for 2024! Aimed at female Year 9 and 10 students, this week-long initiative held from 25–29 November introduces participants to the world of design and construction, industries traditionally dominated by men. Through hands-on experiences, students are inspired to explore future career paths in these exciting fields.

The program takes place at Deakin's Geelong Waterfront Campus and will focus on the disassembly and reassembly of small greenhouses, while applying sustainable and circular design principles. Over the course of the week, participants will work closely with industry professionals and current Deakin students to gain valuable insights into how buildings come together, with key tasks in areas like model-making, site analysis, and design thinking.

In past years, students have shown a marked increase in confidence, engagement, and interest in pursuing related VCE subjects and trade pathways. The opportunity to connect with women leaders in the field, including a dedicated forum with members of the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC), further inspires participants to consider these rewarding careers.

Now in its third year, Deakin aims to strengthen connections with local schools, industry partners, and communities, paving the way for the next generation of women in design and construction.

While the week-long program is at capacity, there is still limited space available for the Industry Forum and Workshop held on Wednesday 27 November. The first half of the day will see participants hear and learn from members of NAWIC about careers and their pathways. Later in the day, secondary students will be split into small groups alongside an industry practitioner and current Deakin students, working together to explore potential solutions to a real industry scenario.

Explore Deakin's pathways into HR careers

The skills to identify, recruit and support talented staff are a critical function of all businesses and are in high demand. With more than 42,606 new jobs projected to be created for HR professionals by 2033¹, now is a great time to explore careers in this field. Find out more about our HR plus recruitment and talent acquisition pathways below.

Bachelor of Human Resource Management (Psychology)

This course explores the human mind in a business context. Graduates will have a significant advantage when performing key functions in human resources roles, from recruitment and workplace negotiations to creating high-performance environments.

Careers

Graduates of this course are ready to take on highly coveted roles such as:

- · HR Professional
- Organisational Development Consultant
- Employee Relations Officer

This course is accredited by the Australian Human Resources Institute (AHRI) and the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC). An APAC accreditation will allow students to undertake additional study to pursue professional registration as a practising psychologist through the Psychology Board of Australia (PBA).

Bachelor of Commerce

The Bachelor of Commerce offers a well-recognised qualification that is a pathway into a human resource management accreditation. Students will get a taste of professional life and get job-ready through work integrated learning and experiential learning programs.

Careers

The HR management major within this course enables students to apply for Australian Human Resources Institute (AHRI) membership. The skills developed and AHRI accreditation will allow students to pursue careers such as:

- HR Professional
- Training and Development Adviser
- Workplace Diversity Manager

Bachelor of Business

The Bachelor of Business equips students with the skills and experience needed to succeed in the business world. Students can study majors such as people management, organisational psychology, or recruitment and talent acquisition. Students will learn to solve practical business challenges, explore innovative and emerging business trends, and prepare for the nuances of international business relationships.

Careers

Depending on the major selected, the Bachelor of Business can lead to various career paths in HR, including:

- Recruitment Consultant
- Employee Engagement Specialist
- Change Management Specialist
- Conflict Resolution Specialist



Bachelor of Psychological Science

From the first year, the Bachelor of Psychological Science allows students to specialise in psychology majors in organisational studies, child and family, or forensic studies. As the only Victorian university to offer these specialist majors in an undergraduate psychology degree, students can follow their passion with the support of a focused curriculum.

Careers

This course is an accredited pathway to further study required to gain general registration as a psychologist. It also opens the door to a wide range of careers for those who wish to enter the workforce sooner, such as:

- HR Management
- Careers Counselling
- OH&S Officer

Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)

This degree has an embedded honours year, distinguishing it from other psychology courses. The honours component includes practical training to prepare students for provisional registration as a psychologist with the Psychology Board of Australia and sets graduates on the pathway to general registration.

Careers

Upon graduating, students will have two distinct career paths: continuing in the pursuit of general registration as a psychologist, or entering employment in psychology-related fields that do not require registration, such as:

- HR Management
- · Careers Counselling
- OH&S Officer

The week promises to be an exciting and dynamic blend of online and in-person design-focused events. There will be a huge range of activities from design exhibitions to workshops, tours, collaborations, cultural events and more. The emphasis will be on cutting-edge innovation, sustainable practices, and creative problem-solving through design.

Alumni from Deakin's School of Communication and Creative Arts will be showcasing their exciting projects including:

- The Narratology of Place Jacinta Kay: This time-based digital work focuses on what it means to be 'of' or 'from' a 'place'. How might we explore the vibrancy and unique cultural aspects of Geelong through form, pattern, animation, sound and projection?
- Arch HIVE Jacinta Kay and Colin Trechter: Celebrate Geelong's rich culture of design, art, architecture, and industry through creative works. Created using scans and photographs of artefacts from The Geelong Heritage Centre Archives coupled with contemporary design ephemera.

 Trans2Located – Deakin/Nagoya: 19 Deakin students, translocate innovations from Geelong to Nagoya (Japan).
 The connection between the two cities' design and manufacturing industry is explored. Along with their contemporary art, design, and technology culture.

Change of preference advice




Introducing DeakinRes' new Night Welfare Team!


