Deakin Law Clinic is a community legal service offering free legal advice and assistance to people experiencing disadvantage in their access to justice, or whose matters are conducted in the public interest.

There is opportunity for students to work in the clinic through a practical elective unit. Under the supervision of qualified practising solicitors, you will interview real clients, conduct research on legal issues and help to provide advice. You also might have the opportunity to attend court proceedings. This professional work experience gives you the opportunity to consolidate the legal skills that you have begun to develop in your academic training. These skills include interviewing skills, complex legal problem solving, legal research, writing affidavits and managing files.

Pursue a legal internship program

Take up an internship placement at a law firm, legal aid provider or government office for credit as part of your Deakin Law School experience. You'll develop the practical legal skills and real-world experience that employers look for in a competitive employment market. This professional work experience gives you the opportunity to enrich your legal education and theoretical knowledge, which will prepare you for employment in the industry.

Gain international experience

Connect with the world through a trimester abroad or short-term study program. Studying overseas helps you prepare for the global employment market, develop interpersonal and academic skills, and learn another language while travelling and having fun.

In 2024, Deakin law students had the opportunity to study contract and human rights law at the University of Exeter in the UK, international business law at Bucerius Law School in Germany and human rights and international law at Masaryk University in the Czech Republic.

Students participated in a transnational law study tour to Universitas Indonesia. They also visited Spain as participants in the Law Without Walls competition and competed in the prestigious Vis Moot in Vienna and Hong Kong.

Deakin Law School students also participated in the Alfred Deakin International Commercial Arbitration Moot. Run by Deakin Law School, with over 40 teams of law students registered from 30 institutions in 13 countries. Bringing together participants from Africa, Asia, Australia and South America, the moot is one of the largest in Australia.

Academics and practitioners from around the world provide feedback to teams based on their own legal training and experience developed in different legal jurisdictions. The event provides an opportunity for invaluable international networking and practical experience for students.

Deakin Law Students' Society

The Deakin Law Students' Society (DLSS) is the peak representative body for all Deakin law students across Burwood and Geelong, assisting more than 500 student members with their educational, career, social and wellbeing needs.

Throughout the year, DLSS members can attend a range of events, including career-based opportunities, social events and competitions. DLSS is independent of Deakin Law School.

You'll develop key skills in communication, problem solving and analytical thinking, and gain the experience employers are seeking through our substantial work-integrated learning opportunities.

Professional recognition

Deakin's Bachelor of Laws is designed to satisfy the academic qualifications necessary for admission to the legal profession. In Victoria, these qualifications have been set by the Victorian Legal Admissions Board (VLAB). In addition to satisfying the academic qualifications, a person seeking admission to the legal profession in Victoria is required to have satisfactorily completed certain practical legal training requirements and must be considered a fit and proper person to be admitted to the legal profession.

Careers

Obtaining a law degree is your first step to entering the legal profession. Upon completion of your degree and the additional practical legal training, you will be qualified to work as a practising Australian lawyer. You may choose to practice in areas of law including:

- commercial law
- criminal law
- equity and trusts
- family law
- personal injury law
- public international and human rights law
- refugee law.

In addition, your degree opens up many other career opportunities. As an alternative to practising as a barrister or solicitor, you may choose to enter:

- business as a consultant, company administrator or business manager
- education
- government or policy adviser with departments or authorities as diverse as the Attorney General's Department, the Office of Parliamentary Counsel, the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, the Office of Public Prosecutions, the Australian Securities and Investments Commission and the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission
- industrial relations
- in-house counsel
- law reform
- media
- politics
- public administration.

Vis Moot international experience

The Vis Moot and the Vis (East) Moot are part of a mock-arbitration competition run annually in Vienna and Hong Kong. Deakin Law School is one of only a few law schools to have participated in both competitions every year since they began.

During the competition, students:

- research two areas of international commercial law (international commercial arbitration and the international sale of goods) in detail and then apply the law to a hypothetical case
- prepare two sets of written legal arguments (one for each side in the dispute)
- prepare for the oral rounds in Hong Kong and Vienna, where you will compete against law schools from around the world.

By taking part in a Vis Moot, not only will you earn a credit point in International Litigation and Dispute Settlement, but you'll also be involved in one of the most highly regarded competitions in the profession, which is great for your future career.

Deakin Law School has a strong track record of success at the Vis Moot. It is one of only four universities worldwide to win the Vienna rounds twice (in 1999 and 2014), was a grand finalist in Hong Kong twice, and in 2017 held the number one place, out of 125 participating teams, in the general Hong Kong rounds. In 2023, a Deakin Law School team made it to the top 32 and finished equal 17th out of almost 400 universities. They were awarded an Honourable Mention for the Eric E. Bergsten Award for Best Team Orals.

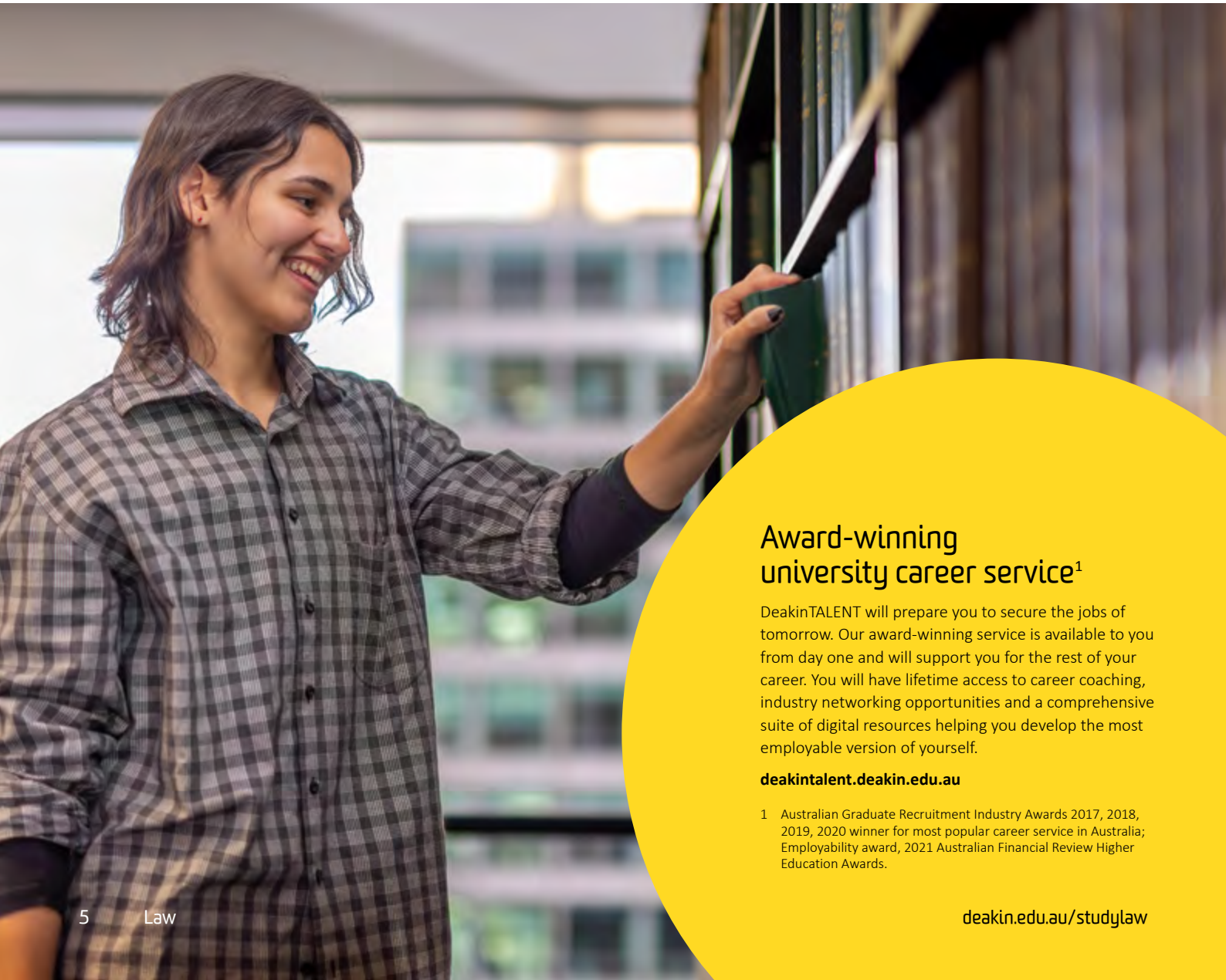

Available to high achieving students who have completed a four-year Bachelor of Laws at Deakin or another Australian institution, Deakin's LLB (Honours) allows you to improve your research skills, hone your analytical abilities and develop the quality of your writing – all skills that are highly valued by employers.
