By signing this document:

- You acknowledge that the cadavers, specimen pots and skeletons used by the School for teaching purposes have been donated by private citizens who have made this decision with a strong sense of altruism, and with the purpose of contributing to the teaching of anatomy.
- You recognise that the cadavers are bodies of deceased persons and must be handled at all times with the utmost respect.
- You recognise that all cadavers must be used and treated within strict accord of any limitations made in donor consent records.
- You recognise that any teaching material including the cadavers and any cadaveric material must not be used in any improper or disrespectful manner and this includes use for entertainment, profit or for personal purposes.
- You recognise that staff and students must not conduct any unauthorised photography or imaging, including via camera, phone or other electronic devices.
- You agree to follow all health and safety directions and attend all safety training as requested, by doing so you are agreeing to abide by the Occupational Health and Safety Act 2004.
