What is the Casper test?

If you're applying to one of the following Deakin courses, you'll need to sit a Casper test to demonstrate your suitability for a teaching career:

- Bachelor of Education (Primary)
- Bachelor of Health and Physical Education
- Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary)
- Bachelor of Science/Master of Teaching (Secondary)
- Master of Teaching (excluding Early Childhood).

If you're enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary) or Bachelor of Science/Master of Teaching (Secondary), you'll need to complete the Casper test in the final trimester of the undergraduate component of your combined degree.

Casper (Computer-based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics) is an online, video scenario-based situational judgement test, assessing a number of non-academic attributes including communication, ethics, empathy, motivation and professionalism.

Deakin covers your Casper test fee

If you're enrolled to start studies from 2026 in an initial teacher education degree, and the Casper test is an entry requirement of your course, we'll cover the test fee with a \$55 payment to you. You do not need to apply for the payment. Deakin will identify and communicate with you at the point of admission.


